He most certainly did not agree with her sinful actions but still respected her as a person. Jesus did not agree with the actions of the Roman government but He still respected their authority. Jesus always showed proper respect to everyone without them needing to "earn" His respect.

We looked at the story of King Saul and David in **1 Samuel 24:8-10** where even though David had been literally running for his life for many years from King Saul, who was trying to actually kill him, when David was given the opportunity to kill Saul, he instead showed him the proper respect that a king deserves.

David understood that, like everything else, God places leaders in their positions so in him unconditionally respecting Saul as king he was actually showing respect to God for His choice to anoint Saul as king. Disrespecting Saul would have been disrespecting God.

We then talked about what all this means to us, today.

In the age of social media, reality TV, and 24/7 news, respect is something that seems to no longer exist in our society.

We don't respect others' opinions, feelings, beliefs, or positions. We don't even bother debating or arguing anymore but instead just immediately attack each other verbally or sometimes even physically for having a different view.

We've lost respect for authority, for our leaders, for our parents, for each other, and have even lost respect for life.

In a country where "Free Speech" is one of our most highly prized amenities, many people are legitimately afraid to say anything or stand up for themselves for fear that they'll be verbally, or even physically, attacked by people who don't agree with them. That's not freedom.

We discussed what we can do with what we learned. We saw that the Bible shows us that, just like love and forgiveness, we can choose to show respect to others regardless of whether we feel they have "earned" it or not. We can disagree with peoples' opinions, beliefs, or even actions in a respectful manner and still show them "proper respect".

We realized that this plan may work well with other Christians who are also trying to do the same but maybe not so well with non-believers or those who choose to not follow the "Golden Rule".

But, while Jesus tells us to treat others the way we would want them to treat us, basic human nature tells us to treat others the way that they treat us. Therefore, if you treat others poorly they will naturally treat you poorly in return but, if you show

them respect, their human nature would generally cause them to respect you as well.	
We said that you can usually get others to follow the "Golden Rule" without them even realizing that is what they are doing. We saw this play out further along in the story about David and King Saul where David's show of respect and kindness to Saul lead to the King ultimately respecting David for his actions and even to Saul no longer trying to kill him. We finished up by reconfirming that like love and forgiveness, respect is not something that needs to be earned. Respect is given unconditionally.	14
We also said that like love and forgiveness, showing respect unconditionally does not mean that you stay in a harmful situation or allow yourself to be walked all over.	14
You can always avoid or get out of a harmful situation (disagreeing with their actions) yet still respect the person (or position). We used the example of an abusive parent where you	M
can, and should, remove yourself from the situation without disrespecting their position as your parent.	X
Acting instead on your feelings by calling them names, putting them down, or being rude towards them is not showing "proper respect" or "honor" even though you have chosen to disagree or remove yourself from the situation.	X
