This week we continued our series on Jesus and Relationships by discussing how it is what is on the inside that defines a sandwich (turkey sandwich has turkey inside, peanut butter sandwich has peanut butter inside, etc.). We also discussed how it is what is on the inside (our character) that defines us.

We reviewed last weeks lesson on grace an understanding then went right into this week to find out what Jesus had to say about anger and bitterness.

We started in **Matthew 5:21-22** where Jesus was basically turning everything the Disciples knew up-side down in the "Sermon on the Mount".

We said that Jesus' problem with the religious leaders of the time was that they emphasized outward obedience to the law and made rules that neglected inward purity and actually drove people further away from God rather than leading them closer to Him.

We learned that what is inside (thoughts, feelings, intentions, etc.) was equally important, if not more so, than outward actions. He even equated anger, insulting language, and wishing harm to come to another with murder. If you're so angry at someone that you wish for them to be dead, Jesus is saying that it's not okay just because you didn't actually kill them. You have committed the same sin as if you did. We said this would have really shocked the Disciples who were likely used to routinely praying for harm to come to others who did them wrong.

The anger and bitterness that we hold in our heart toward somebody hurts our relationship with others and hurts our

America looks like.

Michelle and I took the girls to see this and suggest that our youth, boys and girls, all go see it if possible.

Life Skills Class

Don't miss these great lessons that you can immediately apply to your own every day life. relationship with God. It even hurts ourselves to be walking around with anger and bitterness all the time.

We said that it was okay to GET angry sometimes as long as we don't STAY angry. It's the staying angry that hurts us and others around us. We also said that we are not to SIN while we are angry and noted that Satan will use strong emotions such as anger to lead us to sin and away from God.

We also learned that there is a difference between "just anger" and "unjust anger". Jesus showed "just anger" toward the Pharisees for hurting the very people they were charged with saving or when he cleared the Temple of money changers and merchants because they were taking advantage of the poor people bringing their offerings.

"Just anger" leads to a positive action. Such as us getting angry at bullies who pick on a "special needs" student and then doing something about it or being angry about homeless teens and then doing something about it. We said that anger that leads to violence is rarely the right way.

We recalled, from Conrad's lessons several months ago, that having anger, bitterness and unforgiveness in your heart can lead to barriers in your prayers being answered.

This topic of anger and bitterness as it related to having a good relationship with others is so extremely important that Jesus tells us, in **Matthew 5:23-24**, that if a brother or sister has something against us we should actually interrupt our worship to first go and be reconciled with them.

We noted that Jesus said in verse 23, "your brother or sister has something against you" because it is US who should take the initiative to reconcile with our brother whether we are the ones who are offended or are the ones doing the offending.

We agreed that letting go of anger and bitterness or forgiving someone can be extremely difficult and in fact is impossible to do on our own. That is why we have the Holy Spirit to help guide us.

We also said that there can be times when actually facing the person to be reconciled with them can be physically dangerous and we should never put ourselves in a place of danger. Prayers for them, for ourselves and for the help of the Holy Spirit to help guide us in the direction of making

things right before God.

We closed by praying for forgiveness for the sin of holding any anger or bitterness toward another and asked for help to let it go and to give us the courage and the strength to resolve any situations that may be causing us to hold anger or bitterness in our hearts that effects our lives and all of our relationships including our relationship with Jesus.

THIS FRIDAY February 20th - Movie Night!


