Living Word Ahwatukee 1 Youth Update for the week of 6/14/15

Hello Chris



This week, we started a new series on what Jesus had to say about loving others. We created and discussed various lists of the Greatest things such as restaurants, desserts, sports, etc. and determined that no matter what the list was about, what was the Greatest thing was always just a matter of somebody's

opinion.

We then looked at when Jesus was asked to make a "Greatest List" in **Matthew 22:34-36** where the Pharisees were trying to trick Jesus by asking Him to name the Greatest Commandment. We said that since Jesus only spoke truth, it would be more than just His opinion, His answer would be fact.

We also said that with literally hundreds and hundreds of Old Testament commandments to follow, found mostly in Leviticus and Deuteronomy, knowing which one was the Greatest or most important would be pretty handy. Of course the Pharisees were not really interested in a real answer. They were looking for an answer they could use against Jesus.

We took a look at Jesus' answer in **Matthew 22:37-39** to find that of course loving God is the first and greatest commandment but then Jesus also added that loving others is second greatest. In a list of many hundreds of commandments, Jesus put loving others second only to loving God. We looked closer at the importance of Jesus putting such great importance on loving others.

We found an answer in the very next verse, **Matthew 22:40**, where Jesus tells us ALL of the laws and the prophets are based on these two commandments. So, basically, if you

truly do love God and truly do love others you will inherently fulfill the rest. We said that just about all of the Bible's moral and ethical teachings can be summed up into just these two Greatest Commandments.

We talked about how Jesus was our perfect model for how we are to love others both in the way that He lived and in the way that He loved us by dying for our sins. We talked about God's motivation for sending His Son to die for our sins and found in **John 3:16** that God did it for one reason, because "God so loved the world".

We said that God **IS** Love and He loves all of us. We are all created in His image so that we may also love others just as He loves us.

We also looked at what John had to say in **1 John 3:10** where he equates being a righteous person with being a loving person and says that if we are a child of God we will show love for others just as God shows love for us.

We then created a list of ways we can show love for God including things like studying the Bible, praying, praising God, obeying, trusting, listening, etc. and a list of ways we can show love for others including helping & encouraging others, listening, forgiving, etc. We also found that loving others is even actually another way that we can love God.

Loving God's creation (other people) expresses our love for the Creator. Other people see the love of God in us when we love others. Plus, as we just learned, loving others is second only to loving God as the two greatest commandments and obeying God shows our love for Him.

We explained that the love we were talking about is God's everlasting & unconditional selfless type of love as opposed to what we normally consider human or romantic love to be, often with many conditions or selfish motives attached.

Challenge: This week's challenge is to simply do one new thing, either from the lists we made or something else, that shows your love for another person.

Join us next time as we continue talking about what Jesus had to say about loving those who are difficult to love.
