

Living Word Ahwatukee 1 Youth Update for the week of 9/6/15

Hello Chris



This week, we continued our series on what Jesus had to say about our influence by looking at what affect our actions can have on our positive influence.

We started our discussion by coming up with actions that would typically identify somebody as a

Christian and actions that would typically identify somebody as a non-Christian.

We agreed that trying to tell if somebody is a Christian or not based on their actions can be pretty tricky. Since all are sinners, whether Christian or not, how people behave does not always indicate if they are a Christian. We said that even though we are saved not by our actions but by our faith we can't just ignore what our actions may say about what's really going on inside our hearts or how our actions can affect our influence.

As an example for how our actions may say what's going on inside us we used an orange. When you squeeze an orange, orange juice comes out because that is what is inside. In the same way, when the world "squeezes" you by saying something you don't like, or being mean to you and all you have inside you is anger, bitterness and fear, then that is what comes out of you. When your heart is full of God's love then love is what comes out no matter how hard the world tries to 'squeeze' you.

We then discussed several people in some of our lives, friends & siblings, who positively influenced our faith in Jesus and how they did so by the way they lived or by their actions.

We warned that the opposite can also be true when our actions do not align with our faith and thus negatively influence others.

We read about such a case in **Matthew 23:1-12** when Jesus talked about how the Pharisees who taught the law were more focused on themselves than on leading people closer to God. They made themselves appear to be better and more righteous than the people they led making people feel as if they could never be good enough for God. They demanded special treatment and titles making their faith more about themselves than about God. Jesus said that they do not "practice what they preach" and they do everything "for people to see".

We said that the Pharisees professed to be the righteous leaders of Israel but their motivations were selfish and focused more on themselves than on God or the people they were leading. Since the Pharisees' actions did not line up with their teaching it created a negative influence that ended up driving away the very people they were supposed to be bringing closer to God.

We said that the world, and Satan, are quick to jump all over Christians when they are caught doing something sinful in order to turn their once positive influence into a negative influence to drive people away from God. We talked about a few of the more famous cases in the news.

We were reminded that while we are all sinners, saved by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, our actions do not make us 'good' or 'bad' in God's eyes. But, our Christ-like actions have the opportunity to positively influence others just as our un-Christ-like actions have the real chance to negatively influence them and drive them away from God.

We mentioned that the closer our own hearts are to Jesus, the easier it is to live a Christ-like life. Living a Christian life seems less of a 'burden' to us because as we draw closer to a relationship with God the more we want to do things out of our love for Him as opposed to just following a bunch of rules.

We ended by each thinking about something that we are now doing in our lives that may not line up with our Christian faith and has the opportunity to cause a negative influence on others. We prayed about it and said to think about how we can better align our actions with our faith so that we can

be the positive influence on the world that Jesus wants us to be.
