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Greetings!

This week we started by discussing various labels we put on people, labels they put on us, and even labels we put on ourselves. We talked about how these labels make us feel and how they affect what we believe about others and about ourselves.

We talked about how we can easily misjudge people we don't even know without knowing anything about them. We can even misjudge people we do know without knowing their "story" or taking time to understand them.

This week, we looked at Jesus teaching to look at the world through God's eyes while extending grace & understanding to each other. Specifically, we looked at **Luke 6:41-42** where Jesus asks "why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye?"

We said that the point Jesus was making is that we should be more aware of our own sin than the sins of others. He uses such a ridiculous illustration because it is just as ridiculous for us to point out the sins of others when we have our own sin.

Specifically, He was speaking about the self-righteous Jewish leaders but it is really a message for all of us. We noted that Jesus didn't say "if" you have a plank in your eye. That's because no matter how "good" we may think we are, we all have sin and are all in need of being saved by the grace of God through Jesus Christ.

Don't miss these great lessons that you can immediately apply to your own every day life. to others is realizing that we're all sinners on the same journey and we are all loved by God who extended His grace to us so we can extend that same grace to each other.

Once we understand our own sinfulness and how much we have been forgiven of it makes it easier for us to understand other people's issues that they may be having. It allows us to not automatically jump to conclusions without knowing their story.

The next step is extending the same grace to them as God has extended to us. Grace is basically getting what we don't deserve. So, when we respond to a mean person with kindness instead of anger or when we are quick to forgive others, we are extending grace.

We made sure to point out that grace does not accept or condone wrongdoing. Grace loves despite wrongdoing and considers the person above what they have done.

We were reminded in **Romans 5:8** that God showed us His love and extended His grace to us while we were still sinners. We should therefore not point out faults in others but seek to extend that same love and grace to others despite their sin and let God take care of "fixing" their heart.

We finished up with a **challenge** to identify a person who we may have incorrectly labeled, judged, been critical of, who has let us down, or maybe somebody that we simply just don't like very much. The next time we see that person, talk to them. Find out more about them and let them know more about you. Extend God's love and grace to them despite any shortcomings they may have. You'll find it may not only change their lives but can change your own life as well.

When we see others and see ourselves the way that God sees us we can look past all of the labels that the world uses and focus on the only label that matters. We are all a **"Child of God".**
