Living Word Ahwatukee 1 Youth Update for the week of 5/7/17

Greetings!



Last week we talked about why we should be reading the Bible. We discussed a survey that showed while almost 90% of U.S. households reported owning at least one Bible (average was three), more than half of them reported reading little of it or even none at all.

We looked at **2 Timothy 3:16-17** to see that ALL scripture is God-breathed to be used for teaching, correcting, and training and we agreed it was very important. But, while the Bible seems to be popular in the U.S. to own, people seem to have little interest in actually reading it.

Even among regular Church goers, less than 1/2 reported actually reading the Bible regularly. This all means that most people get their knowledge of scripture "communicated" to them by others rather than having it "revealed" to them by reading and studying the word of God themselves.

As we talked about before, having only "communicated" knowledge makes it much easier for us to be deceived. In the age of Social Media, it becomes even easier for us to be deceived unless we know the true "revealed" word of God.

We said that the internet is full of images and messages that seem to be Biblical and many can not only mislead you to believe it is God's word but some can actually go against the word of God and if you have only "communicated" knowledge you can be easily deceived and led astray.

We discussed a few of the more popular phrases that we tend to see. The first was "God won't give you more than you can handle". This one gets used a lot to make somebody feel better when they are going through a hard time or a tragedy but

this phrase has several issues. First, you won't find it in the Bible anywhere. Secondly, the "God won't give you..." part implies that it was God who caused your tragedy which gives a false impression of God's character. Finally, it's just not even a true statement. God will sometimes lead you to do things that you can't handle without Him to help you grow in your faith and remind you that things that seem impossible for us are never impossible with God.

Another popular phrase that gets thrown around a lot is "Money is the root of all evil". We found that this one is actually a misquote of 1 Timothy 6:10. When we looked at the actual verse we found that Paul actually said it was the LOVE of money (meaning our attitude toward money), not the actual money itself. We also found, by putting it in the context of the surrounding verses, that Paul was actually warning that our attitude toward money can lead us into temptation to do foolish or ungodly things that can cause us to wander from our faith.

The problem with using this phrase is that it implies that Christians should live in poverty or just barely getting by without much money. But, if Christians didn't have much money, how could they help others or build the Kingdom of God? We mentioned many wealthy Godly people in the Bible as well as current Christian Pastors who have a lot of money. Also, Jesus came so that we may have life more abundant, not to have a life in poverty.

The third phrase we discussed is one we hear all the time "Jesus says, Don't Judge". When we looked at Matthew 7:1 it did really seem that is exactly what Jesus meant.

But, when we looked at the verse in the context of the surrounding verses as well as who he was talking about it was easy to see that Jesus was actually saying that we should not judge hypocritically. He was saying that before judging others for their sin, we should examine ourselves and our sin so that we will then see better how to help them with their sin. He was really talking about the hypocrisy of the Pharisees.

The problem with this phrase is that it causes us to believe we shouldn't speak out against what we know is wrong or not stand up for what we believe. Looking at other verses about judging, we found that there is clearly a correct or righteous way to judge others just as there is an incorrect or hypocritical way to judge others.

We finished up by agreeing there are many, many more misleading phrases that can easily deceive us if we don't actually read and study the Bible for ourselves instead of just listening to other people. We also said that it's always important whenever reading the Bible to make sure we look at the context of what is being said, who is saying it and why,

who they are saying it too, where they are, and the time period or culture they saying it in. We also said we should pray to the Holy Spirit for understanding.
