This week we discussed the events that took place in the arrest and trial of Jesus. We started out by remembering a time when we had been falsely accused. This activity was meant to understand the feelings of being accused of an action you didn't do, and possibly any action that you would have been taken to make the person understand that you were not at fault.

Next we read that immediately after the Last Supper Jesus and his disciples went to the garden of Gethsemane. There Jesus prayed to the Father before his arrest. We stopped there to understand Jesus' emotions at the time of the prayer and what he may have been feeling as he prayed God's will over the situation. We then moved into Judas' betrayal of Jesus and how it was God's will for it to happen in the way that it did.

We reminded the students of three major points in this section 1) Jesus is willingly laying down His life; 2) God's will is for Jesus to suffer at the hand of sinners; and 3) the Scriptures foretold this would happen.

Once arrested by the Jewish high priest Jesus was brought before the Roman leader, Pilate to face sentencing. Pilate could not find any crime that Jesus had committed and in order to not upset the Jewish leaders he allows the crowd to decide Jesus' fate. As it turns out the crowd had been bribed by the Jewish leaders to demand Jesus' crucifixion.

To tie things all together we went back to the Old Testament to review the words of Isaiah and his prophecy of the coming Messiah. God's plan all along was to redeem His people through the false accusation, arrest, trial and conviction of Jesus even though he was completely innocent.

We concluded by reminding the students that Jesus willingly laid down his life in order to rescue all from sin and death, and that is the picture of the greatness of God's love.
