### Greetings!



This week we talked about the 613 commands found in God's Law or the Mosaic Law. We specifically discussed what is called the 10 commandments and

the fact that if we broke even just one of the 613 rules, we had broken the entirety of God's Law.

We agreed that the biggest problem with The Law was that it has been shown over and over, since Adam and Eve, that we don't follow rules very well. There is no way we could ever faithfully follow every rule on our own.

We also pointed out that some Christians may even break the 10 commandments **WITH** the 10 commandments themselves. Many times the symbol or monuments of the 10 commandments can become so overly important to some Christians that, much like the Pharisees of Jesus' day, their focus is so much on the rules that they miss God's love and grace which is the real heart of God's law and worship the rules instead.

We then made the claim that we really don't even need to follow the 10 commandments (or the rest of the law). For explanation, we looked at **Matthew 22:36-40** where Jesus tells us that **ALL** of the Law and the Prophets hang on just two commands. Love God and Love others.

We said that Jesus even upped the 2nd command in **John 13:34-35** where he said we are to not only love others but to love others **as He loves us**.

We said that the old covenant or law focuses on our sin and what **WE** need to do while Jesus brings the new covenant of love and grace which focuses on Jesus and what He has done for us. The law brings condemnation while the new covenant brings love, grace, and forgiveness.

#### Foster Care Teens Personal Care Items

1 Youth is continuing to collect "Personal Care Items" for the teens in foster care throughout the year. Items for both male and female teens are being collected in the two bins just outside our youth room. These items will be sorted into personal bags and given to DCS to be distributed to teens who may not even have their own tooth brush or comb.

Whenever you're out shopping for your own personal care items such as soap, deodorant, tooth paste, feminine hygiene items or when you see the "travel size" shampoo, mouthwash, etc., pick up a few extra items and drop them in the bins.

Help share God's love by letting these teens know that somebody As Jesus mentioned in **Matthew 5:17**, the new covenant does not abolish the law. The law is still good to follow as it is given by God and is chock full of good things, not just random rules, to have us live better lives on Earth.

What Jesus did was to have us focus on the heart of the law, **Love**, and with that we will naturally follow the intent of God's law without needing a list of rules that point out our failures and condemn us. With our focus on Loving God and others we don't honestly even want to sin.

So, by loving God and others, we don't really need to follow a checklist of rules (which we can't do anyway).

We then went a step further and said believe it or not, we don't even have to follow those two commandments.

When Jesus ascended into Heaven, God sent the Holy Spirit to live in us, to lead us, to guide us, to give us strength...The Holy Spirit, being God's spirit can only do good and can only bring glory to God. All we need to do is choose to listen.

We said that with the Holy Spirit in us, all we have to do is to listen to and follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit to live as God intended us to live full of love and grace without needing a list of rules to follow.

The Holy Spirit will never, ever, lead us to sin. If we ask and if we choose to listen we don't need a list or have to be told what to do or what not to do or be condemned when we mess up. We will always do what is right naturally. We noted that Jesus didn't follow a list of rules, He followed the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Now, will we mess up and still sin sometimes? Sure, we're still human flesh and we will make the mistake of not listening to the Holy Spirit probably more often than we should. But, through the love and grace of Jesus, God says, it's okay, you are forgiven, try again.
